They say that if you remember the **1970's** you probably weren't really there!

But! If you were there, I'll bet that you remember CB radio, CW Mc Call, Smokies etc. I'll bet that you even had a handle and spoke in 10-code. This was years before cell phones were even on the distant horizon. Citizens band radios provided instant mobile communications and were embraced by literally millions of Americans in an extremely short period of time. The FCC required all operators to apply for a license, call sign. eg: KAA 1234, and at least own a copy of the applicable regulations. 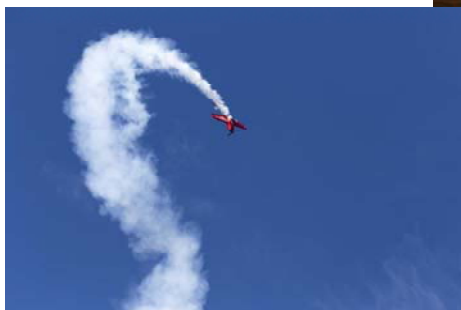
